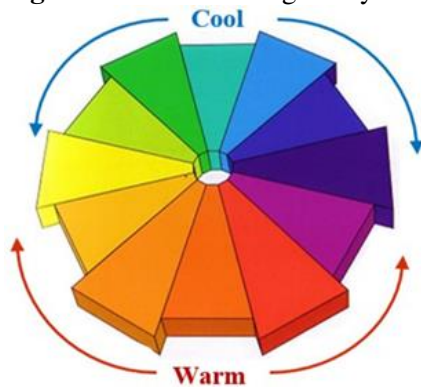


Figure 3. Cool and Warm Colors.

The theme of lighting design covers everything such as functionality, aesthetics and energy efficiency that play an important role in creating a good harmonious and well-lit space.

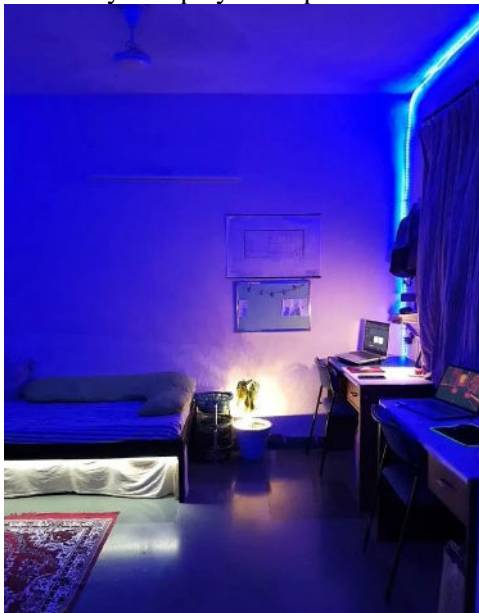


Figure 4. Room With Various Types of Lighting.

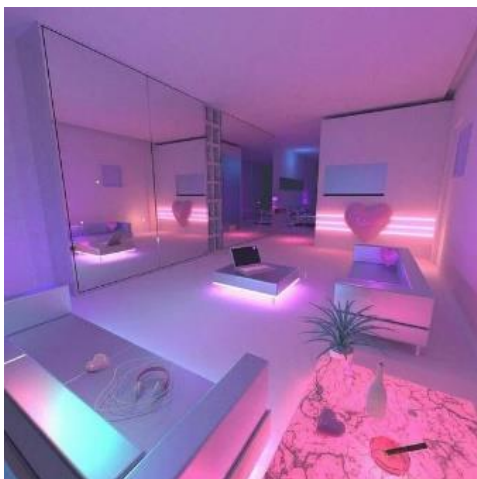


Figure 5. Aesthetic: a room with minimalist design.

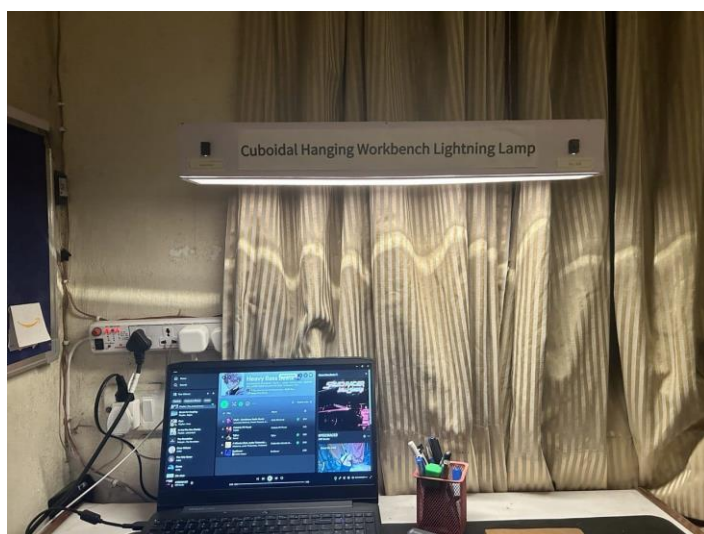


Figure 10. Visual representation of the lamp prototype.
